

## **The Good and the Valuable in Contemporary Value Theory**

ABSTRACT. In this essay I offer a discussion of the buck-passing or fitting-attitude analysis following Brannmark's argument that goodness is reduced to a matter of having properties that provide reasons for pro-attitudes. I argue that the valuable may be considered a subset of the good, if the latter is understood as a matter of relative placement in certain kinds of comparison classes.
